Breaks down American politics into easy-to-understand processes and procedures

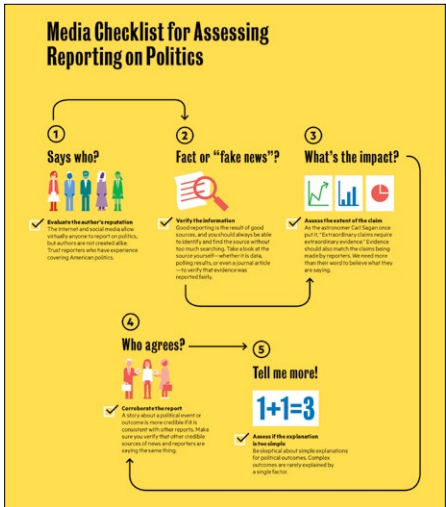

Throughout each chapter the authors highlight these concepts in “Nuts & Bolts” boxes, apply them in **NEW** and revised “How it Works” infographics, and integrate them with the narrative to help students make sense of current events and debates. Questions in InQuizitive, Norton’s adaptive quizzing platform, help reinforce student understanding and application of these concepts, preparing students to recognize the nuts and bolts in action on their own.
